A final decree of Condemnation of vessel and cargo & 2 Lots of Cotton having been pronounced in this case and no appeal taken, and it appearing to the Court that the gross proceeds of the sales are as follows, to wit;

And that the costs expenses and charges as taxed and allowed are as follows, to wit:

Leaving a net residue of Eight Thousand seven hundred thirty eight dollars and seventy one cents. (\$8,738.71) for distribution.

And it appears to the Court, upon the report of the Prize Commissioner that the U. S. Gun Boat "Sagamore" English commanding is entitled to share the sum of Seven thousand six hundred forty nine dollars thirty six cents. (\$7,649.36) and the U. S. Bark "Gem of the Seas" Baxter commanding the sum of one thousand and eighty nine dollars and thirty five cents (\$1,089.35) of the said residue, being the capturing vessels and that said vessels are entitled to share in the Prize and that no other vessels are so entitled and that the Prize was of inferior force to the capturing vessel. It is hereby adjudged and decreed that the said ships are so entitled to share in the said Prize. And it is ordered that the costs, fees and expenses herein taxed and allowed, amounting to the sum of One thousand seventeen dollars and fifty four cents. (\$1,017.54) be paid to the persons severally entitled thereto, from the money on deposit with the Assistant Treasurer of the United States, subject to the order of the Court in this case. And it is further ordered that the said residue of the gross proceeds deposited with the Assistant Treasurer in this case be paid into the Treasury of the United States for distribution.
