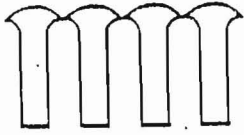

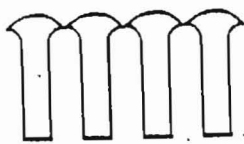

May 1st 1864 ^{HD 20}

In obedience to General Order No. West Lines
I proceeded to meet and inspect Major Lucas' Command
and respectfully submit the following report thereof.
Fort Pemberton ^{located on the St. Johns River} is an enclosed work and mounts
(24) Four 32 Pdrs. two (2) of which are rifled. They seem
to be in good condition, having implements complete &
together with about (100) One hundred rounds of Ammunition
properly placed. One of the Carriages is a bit somewhat
defective. There is also a Carriage in position from which
a 32 Pdr has been removed as I am informed, to be
rifled. There are (3) Three Magazines - two of
which are being used. One of them not being in very
good Order, being rather damp for the preservation
of Ordnance Stores. It has also a capacious bomb
- proof in good Order. The

The Company in charge of this work is commanded
by Captain Richardson Co "SC" P. B. S. A. and has
an aggregate of 49. The Company seems to be in a
very good state of discipline and is armed with an
old English Alpha Musket having 2 grooves, Caliber 69.
They have no bayonets. ^{The guns were in tolerable good order.} The accoutrements are
complete with the exception of Canteens & Haversacks, some
of which are needed. The barracks are ^{neat} well arranged
& ~~properly polished~~ and the grounds about ^{there} well
properly polished. There are about 6500 Cartridges
on hand - the men carrying 10 each in their boxes.
The transportation at this Post is one, one Horse Ambulance
and horse - two 2 Horse Waggons (one of which is
not in good repair) and two mules.

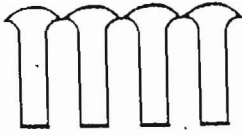
Battery Tynes, commanded by Capt Richardson
Co "B" Lucas' Battalion is located on Stone River
 some $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles below Fort Rumbouten and has 4/
 Four ^{Guns} mounted towit: (2) Two 32 Pdr. rifled - One (1)
 rifled 42 Pdr and one 8 inch Columbiad - There
 is a rifled 32 Pdr dismounted and lying on the ground
 to the rear of No 14 Chamber - This gun I am informed
 has been lying there for months - I respectfully
 recommend that it be either placed in position
 or removed - This Battery is supplied with a Shell
 Room and bomb-proof which requires more dirt in
 than to complete them and render them secure.

The Magazine is complete and very neatly kept
 as indeed is every thing else about the Battery.

There are about 175 Cartridges for each of the 32
 and 42 Pdr - and a corresponding number of
 projectiles - The 8 inch Columbiad is supplied
 with only 29 Cartridges - It should I think be
 supplied with a greater number of rounds. The
 implements are complete and in proper position.

Captain Richardson's Company numbers 69 and
 is armed with muskets (Caliber .69) changed
 from flint & steel to percussion - These guns were ^{at the}
 in excellent ^{order} condition - Each man carries 20 Car-
 tridges in his box and there are 4000 additional
 kept in the Magazine. There are 17 men detailed
 daily for guard duty from the Company. The
 quarters occupied by the Company are tolerably
 good - and they with ^{the} guards about them, were
 neatly polished - The clothing of the Company is
 inferior and I observed a number of barefooted
 men in the ranks, when being mustered & inspected.

Battery Bringle, located also on the Sono River ^{General Wood} below "Tyner" is garrisoned by Capt E McAlhann & "A" Lucas Battalion, having an aggregate of 77. This Battery mounts 2 Refta 32^s - (2) Two reftd 42^s - one 8 inch and one (1) ten inch Columbiad (Smooth bore) and (2) Two 8 inch Navy Shell guns - with implements all complete & in proper positions. This Battery is in splendid condition for a work of the kind and is admirably kept. The 8 inch Guns are supplied with about 100 Rounds each. The 10 inch Columbiad has 185 Rounds - The reftd 42^s with 49 rounds of Cartridges and about 160 projectiles each. The Refta 32 Pdrs each have 45 Cartridges to 184 projectiles to the gun. The reftd Guns should have a better supply of Cartridges at this ~~book~~ Battery.

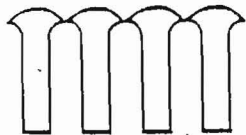
There are two large Magazines here completed. The shelves all numbered & the Cartridges properly placed in them. It has also a large bomb proof complete except the sodding, which is much needed to prevent further injury ~~from~~ ^{by} the rains & winds.

This battery altho easily kept neat so as to present a neat appearance, affords evidence of care & attention upon the part of its Officers. This Company is armed with muskets (Caliber 69) which were found in good order. Accoutrements complete. Cartridge boxes contain 38 Cartridges each. The clothing is uniform and here too as at Battery Tyner I saw a number of barefooted men in ranks in inspection. The ~~guards~~ Company quarters are very good and properly policed - Respectfully submitted
