ROLANDO MASFERRER Y ROJAS, well-known former Cuban senstor and Cuban exile who recently completed a sentence in a Federal penetentiary, was contacted by the writer, telephonically, on 3/3/75. ROLANDO MASFERRER currently resides at 1400 Southwest First Street, Miami, Plorida, with telephone number 305-667-2132, and maintains an office at 2000 West Flagler Street, Miami, Florida, with telephone number 305-541-2367.

MASFERRER was telephonically contacted 3/3/75, at his office, at which time his assistance was solicited relative to recent Killings and bombings which have occurred in communities in Miami, Plorida, and in the New York - New Jersey areas. It was requested of MASFERRER that this office was interested in obtaining identities of individuals responsible for recent bombings, including the bombing which occurred in Elizabeth, New Jersey, on 2/11/75, and also the identity of individuals responsible for recent assasinations of Cuban exiles.

MASFERRER stated that according to information in his possession, those responsible for the events mentioned above are radical individuals from several Cuban exile organizations, and these individuals have sworn their allegance to DcoToR ORLANDO BOSCH of Accion Cubana (AC)-(Sco Appendix)

MASFERRER stated that he currently is publishing a weekly newspaper and that several of the advertisers to this paper have received threats to stop advertising in MASFERRER's paper, and one of the advertisers has already been physically beaten up, and one of MASFERRER's people have been beaten in Miami.

MASFERRER stated that he was willing to cooperate fully, and that he would attempt, through his organization, to obtain the desired information. He also stated that he had had contact from the Miami Office of the FBI, but that in any future contacts, he would prefer that the writer contact him rather than having someone from the Miami Office of the FBI contact him.

Newark, within the next two weeks, will again contact MASFERRER for any positive identification he can furnish regarding identities of individuals responsible for recent acts of violence within the Cuban communities.
