CUBA INTERNS GERMANS

Six Are Accused of Plotting Sabotage of Sugar Crop

HAVANA, Feb. 6—Six Germans accused of fifth column activities were today ordered interned for the duration of the war.

This first internment by the Ur-

gency Court was under a public security decree signed last month by President Fulgencio Batista.

Police charged the Germans with plotting sabotage of the sugar crop, but they were unable to prove specific charges. The court, however, considered the evidence

sufficient to justify internment.
