CUBAN ENVOY MOURNS CAPABLANÇA'S DEATH

Among Those Who View Body Here—Funeral in Havana

Dr. Aurelio F. Concheso, Cuban Ambassador to the United States, who came-here from Washington, was among the friends of Jose Raoul Capablanca, Cuban chess master, who paid their last respects yesterday at Cooke's Funeral Home, 117 West Seventy-second Street, to the man who held the world championship from 1921 to 1929. Capablanca died on Sunday morning of a cerebral hemorrhage suffered at the Manhattan Chess Club on Saturday night.

Consular circles were represented by Consul General Roberto Hernandez, Alfredo Hernandez, New York Consul, and F. Primones, counselor of the consulate.

The funeral will be held after the body arrives in Havana. There General Fulgencio Batista, President of Cuba, will take personal charge of the service. Aquilas Capablanca, a younger brother of the master, and the widow, the former Princess Olga Chagodalf of Russia, accompanied the body from Pennsylvania Station yesterday afternoon.
