GERMAN IS TRIED IN CUBA

Man Accused of Reporting Ship Moves to Enemy Heard

HAVANA, Sept. 18 (U.P.—Heinz August Luning, 31-year-old German charged with advising the enemy of Allied ship movements over an illegal short-wave radio, was tried today in a secret session of the Havana Urgency Court, and, although the case was completed, the verdict was not announced. It was believed the sentence, which could be death, would be announced tomorrow.

Luning, who posed as a Central American business man, was arrested early this month after an investigation in which United States authorities were said to have participated. He was brought to the court room today in a police car guarded by ten patrolmen and detectives.

The prosecution called twelve witnesses, including two radio engineers.
