

BATISTA RISE CELEBRATED

Cuba Marks Tenth Anniversary of 'Sergeants' Revolt'

HAVANA, Sept. 4—The armed forces celebrated today the tenth anniversary of the "sergeants' revolt" that carried President Fulgencia Batista to power.

Government offices were closed, but commerce and industry continued their activity. In contrast to former years, military forts and posts were not decorated or lighted and festivities were somewhat curtailed.

The President addressed the troops at Camp Columbia this morning. He reviewed his accomplishments since he assumed control of the island and reiterated Cuba's intention to give the fullest cooperation to the United Nations in winning the war. He asserted that he would leave the Presidency in October, 1944, and promised honest elections.
