- D And, then I have to send for it.

- C Okay, that's fine, it doesn't matter.
- D And, what I need to know is an exact time, so that I can have it here, and I can give it to you personally, I'm going to give it to you.
- Well, that's fine, it's according to the time I get up. If I tell at nine, and maybe get up at ten.
 - D Well, no, then we'll leave it for the afternoon, for reasons of security.
 - C Okay.
- D Instead of in the morning, we'll make it at six, so that everybody will be free, and there won't be problems of any kind, and the hell with it.
- .C That's fine, okay.
- D Okay?
- C Okay, perfect.
- D Ckay, at six on the dot, in the afternoon.
- C At six--well I'll call you, to tell you where you're going to give it to me.
- D Okay?
- C Okay.
- D Ckay.
- C Okay, that's fine.
- D Okay, bye.
- C Bye, until tomorrow.


