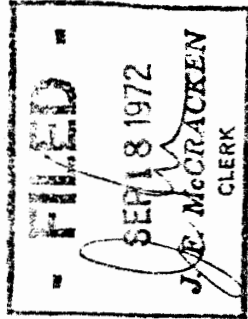

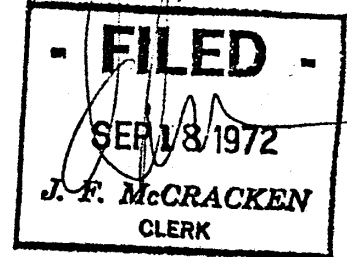

AFFIDAVIT FOR SEARCH WARRANT

Before me, MURRAY GOODMAN, a Judge of the

CRIMINAL COURT OF RECORD, in and for Dade County, Florida, personally
appeared VINCENT OLLER, JR. SGT., DADE COUNTY PUBLIC SAFETY DEPT.

who being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says that he has probable cause to believe and

does believe that on the premises described as: 9970 Banyan Street, Dade County, Florida, a metal building, located on the southwest corner of Banyan Street and Homestead Court, Dade County, Florida, the front of said building facing north and on the front of said building there being the following numerals and letters "9970 Piranha Diesel", said building having a metal fence wall surrounding the afore-described building

being in (unincorporated) Dade County, Florida, the laws of the State of Florida are being

violated TO WIT: a violation of Florida Statute 811.16 that is to say, property which has been stolen is being bought, received or concealed


Affiant's reason for his belief that the laws of the State of Florida are being

violated as stated above and the facts establishing the grounds for this Affidavit and the pro-


bable cause for believing that such facts exist, are as follows: Your affiant has been present during the taking of sworn testimony by Assistant State Attorney William Tunkey from one Jose L. Canto, where-in your affiant acted as a sworn interpreter and from the said Jose L. Canto learned that on or about September 1, 1972 the said Jose L. Canto was robbed at gun point by three white males identified to your affiant as Ramon Donestevez, Emilio Navarro and Alfredo Ruiz by the said Jose L. Canto and further your affiant learned that during the course of said robbery certain property to wit: one man's Omega Seamaster watch color yellow gold with black leather band, one man's yellow gold ring with three inset diamonds, one yellow gold identification bracelet with the inscription JLC in Chinese style letters and the numerals 3-30-30 and the name Chicho, and one 38 caliber Rossi revolver serial No. unknown said revolver having a five shot cylinder and a two inch barrel were taken from the person or custody of the said Jose L. Canto by force, violence or putting in fear and against his will by the afore-mentioned Ramon Donestevez, Emilio Navarro and Alfredo Ruiz, said robbery having occurred at the premises described as: 9970 Banyan Street, Dade County, Florida a metal building, located on the southwest corner of Banyan Street and Homestead Court, Dade County, Florida, the front of said building facing north and on the front of said building there being the following numerals and letters "9970 Piranha Diesel", said building having a metal fence wall surrounding the afore-described building being in unincorporated Dade County, Florida; further your affiant, still acting as a sworn interpreter during the taking of testimony by Assistant State Attorney William Tunkey from the said Jose L. Canto learned that on or about September 12, 1972 the said Jose L. Canto received a type written anonymous letter demanding \$800 cash from the said Jose L. Canto or else his home and automobile would be dynamited, said letter demanding that said \$800 be delivered

on or before September 15, 1972, said letter being ended with the type written word "los tres"; further, on September 14, 1972 the said Jose L. Canto telephonically contacted the said Ramon Donestevez by calling 233-5554 which said telephone number is listed in Greater Miami Telephone Book as being the telephone number for "Piranha Boat Corp., 9970 Banyan Street", said name, address and number being listed at page 777 of the 1971-1972 Greater Miami Telephone Directory, which said telephone conversation was monitored by your affiant with the permission of the said Jose L. Canto, and after the said Ramon Donestevez identified himself to the said Jose L. Canto the said Ramon Donestevez indicated to Jose L. Canto that if the said Jose L. Canto delivered the said \$800 cash to the said Ramon Donestevez on September 15, 1972 at the premises previously described as 9970 Banyan Street, Dade County, Florida that he, the said Ramon Donestevez, would at that time deliver to the said Jose L. Canto the afore-mentioned watch, bracelet, ring, and revolver.

WHEREFORE, Affiant prays that a Search Warrant be issued commanding the Director of the Public Safety Department, Dade County, Florida, who is also known as the Sheriff of Metropolitan Dade County, Florida, or his Deputies, and all police officers in Dade County, Florida, and the Commissioner of the Florida Department of Law Enforcement or any of his duly constituted agents, with the proper and necessary assistance, to search the premises described as: 9970 Banyan Street Dade County, Florida a metal building, located on the southwest corner of Banyan Street and Homestead Court, Dade County, Florida, the front of said building facing north and on the front of said building there being the following numerals and letters "9970 Piranha Diesel", said building having a metal fence wall surrounding the afore-described building. being in (unincorporated) Dade County, Florida, making the search in the Daytime or the Night-time or on Sunday, and to search the said premises and all spaces therein for the property heretofore described, and if the same be found upon the premises, to seize the same as evidence and to arrest any persons in the unlawful possession thereof.


