First Cuban Underwater Vehicular Tunnel Inaugurated

Cuba's first underwater vehicular tunnel was officially inaugurated on April 25, 1953. This tunnel, under construction since 1951, runs beneath the Almendares River and connects Havana with the residential area of Marianao at a point near the river mouth.

The construction of the tunnel itself was carried out by a United States contractor on a cost-plus-fixed-fee basis. Roadways and approaches to the tunnel were built under the direction of the Ministry of Public Works. The entire project is estimated to have cost approximately \$5,500,000.

The tunnel is 216 meters long, has a clearance of 4.38 meters, a center partition and accommodates double lane traffic in either direction on lanes 6.57 meters in width. 0 U1

This project was undertaken to relieve frequent traffic congestions at two double lane steel-girder bridges over the Almendares River that must open to permit passage of boats and barges.
