Also mentioned as possible successors to Mr. Schueg of probably the largest family-owned enterprise in Cuba, with a capitalization estimated as high as \$40,000,000, are two other vice presidents. They are Victor SCHUEG, a son of the late president, and Frank L. DORATHY, Vice President of the Bacardi Corporation of America.

is now a vice president and treasurer of the Bacardi Company.

Mr. Dorathy has offices at the company's p lants in Santiago, Puerto Rico, and Mexico City and at its sales offices in New York. A United States citizen, Mr. Dorathy, who has been with the company for 25 years, is the only non-member of the Bacardi and related families who is said to own a small amount of company stock.

The late Mr. Schueg also was the principal stockholder in the Bacardi Brewery in Santiago and the Modelo Brewery in Habana, the two largest breweries in Cuba. He also personally owned the aqueduct company that supplies water to the U. S. Naval Base at Guantanamo Bay across from Santiago.

Mr. Schueg, who was born and lived most of his life in Cuba, elected to retain the French citizenship he acquired at birth from his parents. His French ancestors fled to Cuba
