Cuban Suggestion that United States Issue a

Commemorative Postage Stamp Honoring

Nurse Clara Maass

I told Mr. Sarabasa that I was informed that President Prio of Cuba has authorized the issuance of a commemorative postage stamp honoring Murse Clara Maass and that Dr. Ernesto Dinigo, Cuban Minister of State, was considering making a suggestion to the Department of State that it endorse the issuance of such a stamp in the United States.

Mr. Scrabasa confirmed that President Prio has issued a decree authorizing the issuance of a stamp honoring hurse Mass and stated that Ambasador Machado had received word from Dr. Dihigo on the subject some months ago. He said that Ambassador Machado discussed the matter then with Dr. Meyer and decided to file it in the Embassy archivos.

I remarked that it might be desirable if the matter were to remain there with no further action being taken because it appeared unlikely that a request for Departmental endorsement of a project to honor Nurse Mass by a United States commemorative postage stamp would receive an affirmative reply. I pointed out two reasons for this: first, that the matter had been informally discussed with the Post Office Department and it was ascertained that the Post Office could not undertake to issue a special stamp monoring Hurse Masss for technical reasons; and, second, that it did not appear likely that the Army and the Office of the Sergeon General would consider hurse Masss as the person most worthy of special commemoration.

Dear rr. Truman:-

Enclosed is the first photograph released by the Department of Posts of the Republic of Cuba of the stamp to be issued on August 24 of this year, honoring. Nurse Clara Louise Maass, U.S.A. who died 50 jears ago in Havana, Cuba, during the experiments to determine the cause of yellow fever conducted by our Army.

Dr. Prio, President of Cuba, has requested our State Department to join hands with his country in issuing this stamp - the first time, as far as I know, that the head of a foreign country has asked us to honor one of our own citizens in so magnanimous and noble a way.

Mr. Fresident, I beg of you to join with. President Prio in a similar homage to the heroic nurse and to ask Mr. Donaldson to reconsider his plan of limiting the 1951 program of commemorative stamps to four.

The nurses of America, under the leadership of the American Nurses Association, as well as the Department of the Army, celebrating the 50th Anniversary of the establishment of the Army Nurses Corps, are on record as favoring this stamp.

Your approval of the stamp is being eagerly looked forward to throughout the Latin American countries where the movement to honor the "Heroine of the Tropics" has met with a tremendously popular reception.

Dear "r. Cale:-

Thank you for your letter of April 6 in which you stated that the matter of a commemorative stamp for Nurse Clara Louise Maass, heroine of the yellow fever experiments conducted by our Army in Cuba in 1901, had been referred back to the Post Office Department.

I understand that the selection of the subjects for postal recognition is the function of the P.O. Department. In the matter of the stamp honoring Nurse Maass, however, another factor has entered the picture which makes this situation unprecedented and des rving of special attention on the part of the State Department and of the President. This factor is the magnanimous action of Dr. Carlos Prio Socarras, President of Cuba, who in a Presidential Decree, authorized the stamp honoring an American citizen for his country and, furthermore, in the most friendly spirit of a good neighbor, asked our country to co-operate with his country in this homage to the Pan-American Nurse, Clara Maass.

The passing of this matter to the Post Office Department, without any further recognition of the friendliness of the Cuban President and State Department by our President and State Department, will be a disappointment to our friends in Cuba, to say the least.

I wrote again to President Truman this week, pleading with him to take up this matter once more with Mr. Donaldson, our Postmaster General, and, since Dr. Prio himself has interested himself in our nurse, to join him in a similar homage to her heroic service to science and humanity by authorizing the stamp for the U.S.

HURSE CLARA MAASS STAMP FOR CUDA

The first photograph of the commemorative stamp honoring U.S. Army nurse, Clara Louise Maass, to be issued by the Republic of Cuba on August 24, 1951, has just been received by the Rev. Prof. Arthur Herbert, President of the Lutheran Memorial Hospital of Newark, N.J. President Carlos Pria Socarras of Cuba on November 10, 1950, authorized the emission of 3,000,000 copies in red, value 2 centavos, in his Presidential Decree 4176. The size of the stamp will approximate that of U.S. commemoratives.

Nurse Maass, a graduate of Lutheran Memorial Hospital, Class of 1895, died in Las Animas Hospital, Havana, on August 24, 1701, at the age of 25 years, as a result of her voluntary submission to the bite of the Stegomyia mosquito, suspected by the great Cuban Doctor Carlos Finlay of carrying the virus of Yellow Fever. The only American to perish in the course of the experiments conducted by the U.S. Army, she. by her sacrifice, gave final proof to the truth of Dr. Finlay's thesis, providing the medical knowledge which later enabled Dr. William C. Gorgas, under whose direction she had participated in the tests, to clear the tropics of the disease and bring the building of the Panama Canal to its successful conclusion.

A similar stamp has been requested of the U.S. Post Office Department by the nurses of the United States, headed by the American Nurse's Association, honoring Nurse Maass as a symbol of "The American Nurse in Feace and War". Congressman Hugh J. Addonizio (D) 11th District of New Jersey on February 10, 1949, introduced Bill H.R. 2609 in the House of Representatives to the same end.

At the present time Hon. Ernesto Dihigo, Secretary of State of the Republic of Cuba is forwarding a request from his government, through Cuban Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary Luis Machado, to U.S. Secretary of State Dean Acheson and the State Department, suggesting that the U.S. Government issue the stamp together with Cuba as a gesture of Eutual esteem and friendship. Dr. Dihigo states in his letter to Ambassador Machado: "The great debt owed by humanity to this young and heroic nurse, her extraordinary abnegation and her unselfish spirit of sacrifice amply justify the proposed homago; for this reason we have deemed it proper? o make an appeal to the government of that country (U.S.A.) in an attempt to win its sympathy in agreement with this sublime purpose".

Governor Alfred Drise 11 of New Jersey, as well as the two State:
Hendrickson and H. Alexander Smith, in letters to and in personal
Secretary of State Acheson, have requested that these appeals be favorable attention.
