Cuban Television Stations in Operation and in Construction

In letter to Embassy of November 4, 1952, Mr. D. R. Stein, COLUMBIA TECHNICAL CORPORATION, 5 East 57th Street, New York 22, New York, requests the names of television stations in operation and in construction in Cuba. Mr. Stein—also wishes to know the names of Cuban sales organizations of electronic components which would be considered suitable distributors for their FLEXIT coaxial high-frequency cables, which are used for television stations, master and antenna installations as well as in many industrial electronics applications. Mr. Stein was informed that he could obtain trade lists ELECTRICAL SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT - IMPORTERS AND DEALERS - CUBA and INDUSTRIAL ELECTRONIC CONTROLS AND INSTRUMENTS- IMPORTERS AND DEALERS - CUBA, for selection of a distributor He was also told that information on television stations in Cuba was being supplied to the Office of International Trade, which would make it available to him shortly.

There are only two companies that operate television stations in Cuba at present, i.e., CMQ-TV, Edificio Radiocentro, "M" y 23, Vedado, Habana and UNION RADIO TELEVISION, S. A., Mazón 52, La Ha-Ubana. In addition to its main station in Habana, CMQ-TV operates Natations in Matanzas, Santa Clara, Camaguey and Santiago de Cuba. There is another concern, RADIO TELEVISION EL MUNDO, S. A., Ambar Motors Building, Calle 23 e Infanta, Vedado, Habana, which expects to have a station on the air in Habana next January or February.

My dear Mr. Follock:
