SUBJECT : JUAN BOSCH IN BOHEMIA ARTICLE ATTACKS AMERICAN DIPLOMATS. STATES LATIN AMERICAN AID TO KOREA IS IMPOSSIBLE IN VIEW OF CONDITIONS PREVAILING IN THE AMERICAS.

An article by Juan BOSCH entitled "The Paradise of the Traitors" and published in Bohemia of September 3, 1950, takes the position that the great masses in the Americas are unable, in view of their hunger, sickness, ignorance, suffering, and lack of culture, to participate in a war to save others from communism inasmuch as their own salvation is the prerequisite to such action. He asks, "What help can Washington expect from this America which has been rotted to the core by reactionaries and Communists?" Bosch then proceeds to attack the leaders of various Latin American countries, including SOMOZA, PERON, TRUJILLO, GORIA, and Delgado CHALBAUD, as well as the Communist leaders in Latin America. He also refers unfavorably to the Spanish loan recently authorized by the United States Congress.
