Dr. Espinosa stated that the Embassy has had confirmation that Senator Chibas pulled out a gun and shot himself in the chest in the course of a violent argument with colleagues in the Ortodoxo party following his weekly radio broadcast on Sunday, August 5.

Dr. Espinosa said that Chibas' condition was serious, but the wound was not fatal and he was expected to live.

Dr. Espinosa recalled that this was the second time that Chibas had shot himself. He said that some five or six years ago Chibas was shot under circumstances indicati that he had tried to simulate an attack upon himself.

Dr. Espinosa speculated that this incident would cause a great deal of political controversy and would not benefit Chibas.

I told Dr. Espinosa that whatever the political principles of Senator Chibas were, he was a distinguished Cuban and, therefore, we would like to extend our condolences. He said that he would inform the Ambassador. I think it would not be appropriate for us to do anything further.

Mr. Wellman suggested to Mr. Clark that the Embassy have a representative present at the funeral, but that the ambassy not send awreath or any message of condolence to the family. Mr. Clark said that the funeral would be a public and probably highly emotional and spectacular occasion. he said that he would probably ask dr. Hoyt to attend on behalf of the Embassy rather than to attend himself or to ask wr. Crain to do so. He concurred that it would be wise to do no more than this.
