# SENSITIVE

DATE: April 30, 1979

Continuing investigation into terrorist activities occurring in Dade County, Florida.

## SYNOPSIS:

On Saturday, 28 April 1979, at 7:15 p.m., this writer was contacted by LOURDES DOPICO, a member of the ANTONIO MACEO BRIGADE, who then provided information.

## DETAILS:

DOPICO related that she had just learned that CARLOS MUNIZ, a member of the ANTONIO MACEO BRIGADE who had traveled to Cuba in December 1977 and who was the head of VARADERO TOURS in Puerto Rico, had just been the victim (on 28 April 1979 at approximately 4:00 p.m.) of a terrorist attack in Guaynabo, Puerto Rico. She stated MUNIZ was in critical condition after having been shot in the head.

DOPICO related that on 28 April 1979 at 9:00 p.m., the ANTONIO MACEO BRIGADE would show a movie at the First Unitarian Church, 7701 S. W. 76 Avenue, and that because of the shooting in Puerto Rico and other threats which the group had received, there may be some problems at that location.

On 28 April 1979 at 7:40 p.m., this writer contacted Sgt. D. Tagerty, Sta. #7, and advised him of the information and the possible trouble in the district. Sgt. Tagerty advised he would keep some marked units in the area of the church for the duration of the movie.

On 30 April 1979 at 11:00 a.m., LOURDES DOPICO contacted this writer. At this time she advised that CARLOS MUNIZ had died of the gunshot wounds in the early morning hours of 30 April 1979. She further related that OMEGA 7 had privately claimed credit for the MUNIZ homicide and have expounded threats against three other members of the ANTONIO MACEO BRIGADE who reside in Miami and Puerto Rico:

RAUL ALZAGA (Puerto Rico)

CARLOS ESTRADA (SIBONEY TOURS, 1801 SW 1 St.)

VICENTE DOPICO (CUBA TRAVEL, 1701 W. Flagler St.)

DOPICO further stated that on Sunday, 29 April 1979, the members of the ANTONIO MACEO BRIGADE held a motorcade down S. W. 8 Street in protest of the MUNIZ shooting.

On 1 May 1979, LOURDES DOPICO, VICENTE DOPICO, MANUEL ESPINOSA, and several other members of the ANTONIO MACEO BRIGADE will travel to Puerto Rico to attend the funeral. This writer will contact Puerto Rican authorities and advise of the potential for further shootings or other terrorist attacks in Puerto Rico.

## SYNOPSIS:

On 28 March 1979 at 10:30 a.m., this writer was contacted by VICENTE DOPICO who then provided information.

## DETAILS:

DOPICO stated that on Saturday, 31 March 1979, from 8:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m., his group, AREITO, will be showing a Cuban film entitled "De Cierta Manera" at the First Unitarian Universalist Society, 7701 S. W. 76 Avenue.

DOPICO related that the movie is a satire of life in Cuba during pre-Castro days. He stated his group has shown films at that location in the past and have had no problems even though they have had two hundred people in attendance.

DOPICO feels that because a notice of the film was placed in the Miami Herald, and because of the recent bombings in New York, there may be some problems during the movie.

This writer contacted Sta. #7, Officer J. Vail and Administrative Lieutenant R. Cox, and advised them of the information so they could alert the units which will be on during that shift.

Investigation continues.
