Subject

: Investigation into Cuban Revolutionary Activities.

- 1. On June 28, Mrs. Edith Fischkin, 1910 SW 7 St., Miami, reported suspicious activities of a number of Cuban males at an apartment located at 710 SW 19 Avenue, Upstairs apt. She stated she was disturbed nightly by meetings and large congregations of persons and that she had observed them carrying large boxes into the premises.
- 2. Ascompanied by Dep. Roy Longbottom, I re-interviewed complainant and her husband at their on on Tuesday morning July 1st. She stated that the boxes she had seen appeared to be of the same size and that her son reported that he had seen this type of activity at 3 and 4 am on several occasions. Mrs. Fischkin stated she had notified the Miami Police on several occasions of the disturbances but they had merely dismissed the matter as a disorderly party.
- 3. The premises were placed under surveillance on Monday and Tuesday evenings, June 30 and July 1st, and little activity was noted. On Wednesday July 2nd, Longbottom and I went to the property and requested permission to enter and discuss the complaints with the occupants. Permission was received to search the property and it appears that it is being used as a headquarters for the Directoric Revolutionaric and 26th of July revolutionary groups. A mimeograph machine was discovered and numbrous pieces of propanganda literature and samples were requested and included in this file.
- 4. A membership list was observed and a copy made and it is also included in the case file. A list of subscribers to what appears to be Cuban Revolutionary War Bonds was found and also a .45 cal. Colt automatic pistol. The latter was seized and will be turned over to the lab for ballistics check. Copy of receipt for pistol and clips is attached to this file.
- 5. Six persons were present and questioned concerning their immigration status. Passports and visas were checked and one, <u>ARMANDO HERNANDER AMARO</u>, WM 25, was arrested for failure to have his immigration identification papers on his person and it was later determined that the Immigration Service had issued a warrant for deportation against this person.

The above complaintant called this office this date to state that the Aparment house directly behind her house, at 808 - 810 SW 19 Ave has the upstairs apt. rented to a group of several Cuban males, that they have strange and unuaual goings-on there until late hours at night; the other people in the apt. house (downstairs) have told her these men are Rebels. This date she saw them carrying fin numerous boxes, approx. the size of beer cases. She states a <u>MR. MICHAEL KENNEY</u> is agent for the people who own this property and handles the renting of same.

Complaintant states she has had the Miami police out several times to breakup parties late at nite, but nothing has been done about these men.

Possibly this could bear checking by your sqad; the boxes she saw today could b be beer for a party or something else.
