SUBJECT: ALLEGED CUBAN REVOLUTIONARY ACTIVITY AND
NARCOTIC VIOLATIONS

On Wednesday, September 17, 1958, Deputy Frank Cilencion reported a confidential informant had advised him that a W/M, Gonzalez, had two important letters to Fidel Castro, and a quantity of Drugs and narcotic implements in room 10 of the Gomez Hotel, 239 N.E. 2nd Avenue, Miami.

Sgt. McKee, and Agents Longbottom and Billbrough went to the location and requested permission from the hotel manager to inspect the apartment. A search was conducted and one letter addressed to Castro was discovered, and it stated the writers sympathetic political philosophy in connection with the Cuban Situation. Additionally, a quantity of material in medical bottles, a bag full of leaves, numerous powders and needles and medical syringes were found.

All of the suspicious material was examined by the Department lab and found not to be drugs. Dagoberto Gonzalez, W/M, DOB 3/09/09, alien resident number A 10 349 616, of room 10, Gomez Hotel, was located at his place of employment, the Club Latino on N. W. 5th St., and requested to come in for questioning.

He stated he was a registered male nurse in Cuba and had been using the needles and medicines for self medication in connection with an eye disease. He denied any knowledge of revolutionary activities in Miami and stated he expected to soon be licensed as a nurse, and expected to accept employment locally. He was released and all property was returned except several obscene photos which were destroyed.
