SUBJECT: ALLEGED STORAGE OF ARMS

This Unit received information from a usually reliable source concerning the possible storage of arms at a residence at 2787 S.W. 32 Avenue.

On June 4, 1959 at approximately 6:30 PM, Agents CLODE, LONGBOTTOM and TARABOCHIA went to the address in question.

The house is a white frame bungalow on the east side of S.W. 32 Avenue and is occupied by a Cuban family named OTERO.

MRS. MARY OTERO was at home with her two children and invited these Agents inside. On being questioned about the presence of arms she stated there were none and invited us to search the house, which we did with negative results.

MARY OTERO is employed as a meat packer by the Miami Provision Company at 2301 N.E. Miami Ct., Miami. Her husband, FREDERICK OTERO is employed by the Barco Chemical Service at 7760 N.E. 4th Ct., Miami as General Manager.

MRS. OTERO further stated she is a Puerto Rican and is not a citizen; her husband is Cuban, but he is a citizen.

There were several pictures of FIDEL CASTRO about the house. Also found in the house was a picture of CAMILO CIENFUEGOS and the yacht "Gamma" which was used by CASTRO in his return to Havana, and several 26th of July stickers.

FREDERICK OTERO did not return home from work during the time we were at the house. A canteen service delivers the meals to the OTERO family due to the long hours both work.

No arms or ammunition were found either in the house or on the grounds at this time.



SUBJECT: SUSPECTED CUBAN REVOLUTIONARY ACTIVITIES


