- l. Recieved a call from TROOPER CANNON, FHP, at 3:50AM this date in which he related to me that he had had a call from one "BULL" QUINCY, attendant at Stevens Van Terminal, NW 27 Ave and 95 St reporting the fellowing:
 - A truck driver whom he does not know but who has been around for the past two or three days waiting for a load out, driving a large size International truck, got a call from a man who gave the name JOHN A STOVALL, but no address or phone number. This man, STOVALL, wanted to hire this driver and his truck for a trip to TAMPA and return to MIAMI; purpose of the trip is believed to be to pick up a load of firearms. The above mentioned truck driver refused the trip, and is supposed to be heading out for Jacksenville the morning of 6-16-59.
 - b. Trooper Cannon called Quincy back and tried to get more information on this but Quincy claims to know no more about it, does not know the name of the driver, where he is from, etc. It is not clear whether the unnamed driver got a phone number to contact Stevall or not, but apparently would not admit it to Quincy if he did
 - 2. When he originally called the FHP office, Quincy requested that the infermation be relayed to Cpl. Gracy.
