

GEN. WALKER IN AN AFFAIR OF HONOR.—A correspondence is published in the New Orleans True Delta, explanatory of an affair which nearly occurred between Colonel S. A. Lockridge and Gen. Wm. Walker. Colonel Lockridge met Gen. Walker on the street and denounced his late book on Nicaragua as totally false so far as related to the former, informing him also that he should hold him responsible therefor at an early day; to which Walker answered, "When you please, sir."—Col. Lockridge then sent a note by his friend, H. H. Purdon, which note, it appears, was withdrawn for explanation. In answer to another note, Gen. Walker replied that in his book he "did not intend to impugn the honor or courage of Col. Lockridge," and so the affair ended without an appeal to pistols.
