We have received 'El Centro Americans,' of Granada, to Oct 31st, and the 'Gaseto Olloial,' of Inegua, to Oct 24. The Gaceto coatains a

declaration of war against Costa Rica, which states that the government will preserve its rights to the whole line of transit from San Juin del Sur, as well as to the District of Guanac ista.

Another decree in the same paper names Don
Gregorio Juarez and Don Rosalia Cortez as
t hiefs in charge of the government, during the
the Generals, Martinez and Xeres, take
charge of the army. Don Marcarlo Alyarez is

charge of the army. Don Marcarlo Alvarez is named Secretary of War. Gen. Tomas Martinez has been appointed commander in chief of 
the army.

A letter is spublished from Col. C. F. Cauty, 
(no date of place,) calling on Col. Segundo 
Cuaresma, commander of the fort of San Carlos,

Cuaresma, commander of the fort of San Uarlos, to surrender to him, in the name of the Costa Rican Government. In case of non compliance, his orders are to blockade the fort, and starve it out. Report says that Col. Cauty is on the lake in one of the steamers, and that he had been fired upon by the Nicaragnan forces.
