

DIED.—On last Monday, Colonel A. T. Kudler, a well known citizen of Augusta, died at the Hot Springs in Arkansas. Colonel Kudler was the friend and companion in arms of the great filibusterer General Wm. Walker. He accompanied Walker in both of his trips to Nicaragua, and was his second in command of the last expedition. His great nerve and fine military abilities were conspicuously displayed in both campaigns. When the last invasion resulted so disastrously, he and Walker were both captured, and both sentenced to be shot. The efforts of Colonel Kudler's friends in this country, however, effected his pardon and release. In 1861 he entered our army and served with distinction as a Colonel. He had been in bad health for some time previous to his death.—*Chronicle and Sentinel, U.S.*
