Col. Doubleday, who resides at Brighton, and who has been with Gen. William Walker from the first, visited the office of the Cleveland (Ohio) Plaindealer on Thursday last, and gave the editor of that paper permission to publish the following:

MOBILE, OCTOBER 10, 1858.

SIR: You are advised that on the 10th day of November next a vessel will leave this port for San Juan del Norte. She will take any passengers and freight that may offer for Nicaragua.

If you or any person in your neighborhood desire to emigrate to Central America please advise me of it as soon as possible, in order that passages may be secured for you and your companions. It will be well for you to arrive here three or four days previous to the day of departure.
