Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas Territory, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by Samuel W. Hooker, of Leavenworth County, Kansas Territory, according to the provisions of the Treaty with the Delaware Tribe of Indians, concluded on the Fifth day of May, 1854, for a tract of land, designated on the official Plat of survey as the South East quarter of Section Twenty Five in Township Eight of Range Twenty in the District of Lands subject to sale at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas Territory, containing one hundred and sixty acres

Now, Know ye that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and pursuant to the provisions of the Treaty aforesaid, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Samuel W. Hooker and to his heirs the said tract of Land above described, To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature hereunto belonging, unto the said Samuel W. Hooker and to his heirs and assigns forever

Given under my hand at the City of Washington, the first day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight and of the Independence of the United States the eighty-third
