The News at the Headquarters of the Fillibusters—Important relative to the Steamer Daniel Webster. At the nead-quarters of the Fillibusters last

evening the news from Nicaragua was the theme of lively conversation. The intelligence that the enemy had taken possession of the transit boats was received with anything but satisfaction; while on the other hand the news of the junction of Henningsen and Walker at Rivas was hailed with delight.

It seems that the mission of the Daniel Webster was

suspected by the fillibusters soon after she left New-York, and ALEXANDER C. LAWRENCE, Esq., telegraphed to Mr. Moncossos, the agent of Gen. WALKER at New-Orleans, to the effect that reliable information had been received here confirming the opinion that the Webster was destined for Nicaragua with a view to assist the allied forces. This disnatch reached New-Orleans on the 25th ult. the day proceeding that on which the Texas was to leave with a large number of recruits for WALKER. The sum of \$1,200 was immediately raised among the sympathizers there to equip the men going out by the Texas, and that vessel sailed as already noticed on the 26th, with a well-armed force of about 500 men.
