

## Nicaragua.

Colonel P. F. MANCOSOS, of the Nicaraguan Army, leaves on the *Texas* to-day for Nicaragua, so that he may arrive at the exact state of affairs in the new Republic, and report to the citizens of the United States the position of WALKER and his army. The Colonel takes with him 500 emigrants and a considerable amount of provisions for the army. Capt. ELLIS, of the Nicaraguan army, who has been for a short time on furlough, also returns to rejoin the army.—*N. O. Courier*.

The following is an extract from a letter written on the 2d inst., from Virgin Bay, by Don BRUNO VON ATZMER, Inspector-General of the Nicaraguan Army, to Hon. PIERRE SOULÉ:

"I think we were bound to make sacrifices to advance our interests and secure their success. The destruction of Granada was a sad affair, but our cause required it; and we have already experienced the advantages to result from it, as our cause has gained in one month what it had not been able to gain in a whole year before.

Our position is at this moment good and secure, and perhaps within four weeks I shall be able to inform you of the complete destruction of our enemies.

The burning of Granada caused all the inhabitants to remove, and in that way we have discovered who were our friends and who our enemies among them, which was difficult to find out previously.

Those who chose to accompany us were protected in the fullest sense of the word, and are at present among us, at this place, where we are anxiously expecting the result of the contest between our forces and those of the enemy at Granada, where Gen. HENNINGSEN is posted, covering our rear."
