

ROBBED ON THEIR BRIDAL TRIP.

MR. AND MRS. SCHLESSINGER LOSE
SOME VALUABLE JEWELRY.

Mr. and Mrs. Louis Schlessinger of Guatemala, who sailed for Europe on the steamer La Gascogne on June 6 on their bridal trip, were not in a happy mood when they started. They had arrived from Guatemala on June 2, bringing with them a leather bag containing nearly \$14,000 worth of jewelry, mostly presents to the bride. While the bag was lying on a table in their stateroom on the steamer Ceballos, upon which they came north, Mr. Schlessinger saw a tall, dark man eyeing it closely. No significance was attached to the fact then.

On the night before La Gascogne sailed, the same sachel was left on a stateroom table. Mr. Schlessinger was smoking on deck when he saw a man descend into the cabin who reminded him of the stranger on the Ceballos. Soon after the man came up and went ashore. On going below, Mr. Schlessinger did not find the bag. It had been stolen.

Two days later United States Deputy Marshal Bernhard held a man who answers the description of the person given by Mr. Schlessinger in custody until the Elbe had sailed, as he had been acting suspiciously upon that steamer. At the time he did not know of the Schlessinger robbery. The newly-married couple continued their trip to France, but left word that a reward of \$1,000 would be given for the return of the jewels. There are three diamond rings, one diamond brooch, two sapphire and diamond rings, a diamond half moon and star, a gold watch, a gold bracelet, a combination collar of diamonds and gold links, two diamond earrings, and three diamond and pearl brooches.
