

FUNERAL OF GENERAL FARNUM.

The funeral of the late General J. Egbert Farnum took place at two o'clock yesterday afternoon, from his late residence in Stuyvesant street. There was a large number of relatives and friends of deceased present, among whom were Generals McDowell, Hendrickson, Shaler and Spinola; Colonel Beebe and many others. The coffin was of massive rosewood, handsomely ornamented. The casket was covered with floral tributes. On the plate was the following inscription in old English letters:—"Brigadier General J. Egbert Farnum, died May 18, 1870, aged forty-seven years."

The religious services were conducted by Rev. William H. Boole, late Chaplain of the old Excelsior brigade. The following gentlemen acted as pall bearers:—General Pleasanton, General Farnsworth, General Graham, General De Lacy, General McGregor, General E. F. Plato, Colonel Burke, Colonel Potter. The First Regiment Infantry, N. G., S. N. Y. (Hawkins' Zouaves), acted as escort. The command paraded with full ranks, with the usual badge of mourning. Former companions in arms of the deceased were present from Boston, Philadelphia and Washington. The remains were taken to Greenwood for interment.
