ARRANGEMENTS FOR HIS RECEPTION IN NEW YORK
TO-MORROW NIGHT.

The committee appointed at the meeting held in National Hall last Thursday night, met on Saturday evening at 335 Broadway. Capt. John Creighton was called to the chair, and Alexander C. Lawrence officiated as Secretary. The following arrangements were made for the reception of General Walker, who will arrive in this city to-morrow evening, via South Amboy:—

Colonel George B. Hall has notified the officers and members of the Independent Battalion of Rynders Grenadiers to meet at their head quarters, National Hall, this evening, for the purpose of receiving orders in reference to the reception of the Nicaraguan President. Military companies and associations who intend joining the procession are to report their intention to the Grand Marshal, at 347 Broadway. The Rynders Guard will number six companies on the occasion, and will consist of cavalry, artillery and infantry; in all upwards of 300 men. They will form at National Hall, Canal street, to-morrow afternoon, at 4 P. M., and march down through the Park, to the Battery, where the artillery will fire a salute, of one hundred guns on General Walker's landing. Carriages will be in waiting to receive the Reception Committee and their distinguished guest; the procession will reform and march for the Park, where the welcoming speech will be delivered on behalf of the citizens of New York. The procession will then escort the General to the El. Nicholas, where apartments have been prepared for his reception.

Alderman William Wilson, with two other gentlemen, have been deputed as a committee to the Common Council to request their co-operation in the above proceedings, not however, it is stated, in a financial point of view. The subject will come up before that body this evening.

Such are the present arrangements for this reception, but the members of the committee will meet this evening at 335 Broadway, and the plans may be modified in consequence of the hoped for action of the Common Council. General Walker will be in the city at 7 o'clock to-morrow night.
