

## The Reception of General Walker.

### ARRANGEMENTS OF THE NATIONAL HALL COMMITTEE.

An adjourned meeting of the committee appointed for the purpose of completing the arrangements for the reception of General William Walker, of Nicaragua, was held last evening at No. 535 Broadway. Mr. John Creighton occupied the chair, while Mr. Alexander Lawrence officiated as Secretary.

Alderman WILSON, Chairman of the Reception Committee, moved that ten carriages be hired for the committee, and that one of them, to be drawn by six horses, be appropriated for the use of General Walker. The motion was agreed to.

Mr. CAMPBELL, Chairman of the Committee of Finance, reported that subscriptions to the amount of nearly \$100 had been received for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the reception. This amount was all that was necessary for the purpose.

They will form at National Hall, in Canal street, this afternoon, and will march to the Battery, where the artillery corps attached to this company will fire a salute of one hundred guns on the arrival of the distinguished guest in the steambest John Potter.

On the arrival of the John Potter the procession will be formed, and the company will proceed to the Park, where the welcoming speech will be delivered. General Walker will then be escorted to his apartments at the St. Nicholas Hotel, where he will spend the remainder of the evening in receiving the congratulations of his friends and admirers in this city.
