

William Walker in New-Orleans.

NEW-ORLEANS, Monday, Feb. 1, 1868.

M^r William Walker appeared before the United States District Court this morning, when Judge McCaleb said there was nothing against him, the Grand Jury having refused to find a bill against him. Walker then asked to be put on trial for violation of the Neutrality laws, which the Judge refused, as the District-Attorney said there was nothing against him, unless new instructions were received from Washington.

On Sunday morning a large fire occurred, consuming the Magazine-Street Market and some adjacent stores, and causing a loss of over \$50,000.

Another fire took place this morning in Canal street. Both are supposed to be the work of incendiaries, and the loss in either case is mainly covered by insurance.
