Extract from a communication received from the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania, April 5th, 1802.

“A letter from Brother Robert Pickering, Secretary of Athol Lodge No. 7, Lucia, Jamaica, was read [in the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania]. It communicated that Moses Levy, a Jew, near six feet high, well proportioned and a good looking man—Cuthbert Potts, a squat, well proportioned man, by trade a saddler, about five feet eight inches high—and Alexander M'Callum, an officer in the excise office there, a thin man and much pock-pitted in the face, about five feet seven or eight inches high, should be guarded against, in case of their making their appearance among us, they being IMPOSTORS.”
