
AFFAIRS IN KANSAS —A correspondent of the Cincinnati Gazette furnishes some items of interest from the Territory of Kansas. His last letters state that nine more of the free State prisoners escaped from the jail at Leecompton, and that the next day one was set free by Col. Titus, on condition that he would meet him at St. Louis and enlist for Nicaragua. Among the nine who escaped was Capt. Mitchell.

The Captain Walker who commands the company of militia at Lawrence, and who headed the successful attack on Titus' fort, is a Pennsylvanian, who emigrated from Franklin county. He is not over 28 years old.
