
AFFAIRS IN KANSAS.—Everything indicates present and prospective peace and quiet in Kansas. Moderate free State and pro-slavery men appear satisfied with Gov. Geary's administration. The disbanding of Capt. Walker's and Col. Titus' militia has been already noted.

The land sales at Leavenworth had, at last accounts, progressed without anything of unusual interest. The land had been sold as far east as the vicinity of Stranger's Creek. It would be at least two weeks before it reached the neighborhood of Kickapoo, Leavenworth or Delaware. As high as \$4 per acre had been given for the land, and for the last few days it had ranged from \$3 75 to \$4 per acre.
