

Kansas Meeting.

A very large and respectable meeting of the citizens of Columbia convened at the City Hall, on Tuesday evening, for the purpose of hearing Major Wilkes on the affairs of Kansas.

The Hon W. F. DeSaussure was called to the Chair and introduced Major Wilkes to the meeting, who made a capital speech, showing the importance of Kansas to the South, and the necessity of immediate action on the part of the Southern States, or Kansas will be lost, and with her, sooner or later, our cherished institutions. After the conclusion of Major Wilkes's manly and patriotic speech, the following resolutions were unanimously adopted:

Resolved, That this meeting resolve into a Kansas Association, to be called the Second Kansas Association of Columbia.

The former Kansas Committee having discharged its duty, and forwarded to Kansas good men and true, with means to maintain them for a twelve-month; but it having become manifest that a larger supply both of men and means to sustain the cause of the South in Kansas has become indispensably necessary, and that the nefarious designs of the Abolition party, the enemies of the South and of the Union, will ultimately prevail in Kansas unless new efforts are made to defeat their unholly schemes for the usurpation of that Territory

Resolved, That a new committee of fifteen be appointed, with instructions to solicit subscriptions in every part of the district, and earnestly to invite the co-operation of every man true to Carolina in a general effort to save Kansas from the Vandals of the North who were hired to invade it, and who are ruthlessly engaged in carrying out the designs of their masters by murder and pillage.

Resolved, That the Committee be instructed to apply the funds to be raised either in raising and equipping new emigrants, or in otherwise maintaining the just rights of the South in Kansas.

Resolved, That the Chairman of this meeting appoint the Committee.

The Chairman appointed the following Committee:

For Columbia—Col. William Wallace, Charles Thomas Howell, John H. Pearson, John S. Green, J. Saunders Guignard, Jr, William K. Bachman, Josiah Bedon.

Fork—Dr. D. W. Ray, John R. Brown, Paul S. Chappell, John Hopkins.

Comp Ground—John H. Kinsler, H. D. Hameter, Dr. Samuel Bockhardt, William H. Stack.

On motion of Dr. Gibbs, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

Resolved, That the thanks of this Association be and are hereby presented to Major Wilkes, for the very instructive, able and eloquent address with which he has favored us this evening.

The meeting then adjourned.
