

Disbanding of the Troops.—Correspondence between the Volunteers and Gov. Geary.

Shortly after Gov. Geary's arrival in the Territory, he called for volunteers from among the citizens, to aid him in putting down outlaws and preserving the peace of the Territory. Two companies were mustered into the service, for three months, one a cavalry company, commanded by Capt. John Wallis, and the other infantry, commanded by Capt. John Donaldson.— Their term of service had not quite expired, but as they deemed their services were no longer required, as peace and quiet had been restored, they asked to be discharged. These two companies were under the command of Col. H. T. Titus. All of the officers and men deserve the highest praise, for they have sacrificed their comfort, time and business, for the public good. The Governor, at the risk of remuneration has caused the men to be paid out of his private funds. In this he has shown a willingness to sacrifice much for the securing peace and good order to our hitherto distracted Territory.
