A GREATER THAN JEFFREYS.

When, brought before Judge Le-compte, in May last, to answer the charge of treason, ourself and fellow-defendants asked to be discharged on bail, the Judge refused to hear our reasons for making the motion. We gave them, and introduced negative evidence showing that we had never committed the crime with which we stood charged. The Judge inquired of us if we had been in the habit of calling the statutes of the Territorial Legislature bogus laws. We told him we had, and believed them to be such. Whether we exposed the motion on that account we cannot say. It would have influenced his action, else he would have considered it important to put the interrogatories he did. According to the opinion of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Kansas Territory, as intimated by him while presiding in the District Court, an expression that certain laws are invalid, by one, is to commit the crime of levying war against the United States. At the risk of being again arrested on some frivolous pretext, we give it as our opinion that a greater than Jeffreys is here.
