

## News from Kansas.

St. Louis, Oct. 2, 1856.

A letter to the *Republican*, dated Leecompton, Sept. 26, gives the following cheering intelligence:—

The armed bands that have been ranging through the Territory are dispersed—citizens are returning to their claims—business is reviving—confidence is restored, and peace reigns throughout the Territory. Warrants have been issued for the arrest of Messrs. Jones, Striegfellow, and other pro-slavery agitators. Gov. Geary has appointed Col. Titus to form a volunteer battalion to preserve the peace in the neighborhood of Leecompton, and he has awarded the same duty to Capt. Walker in the vicinity of Lawrence.
