

CHICAGO, Aug. 22.—Leavenworth Journal and Herald, Westport, Border Russian, Independence, Dispatch and other western Missouri papers contain full startling conflicting accounts, and flying rumors from Kansas, generally agreeing that the Missourians are badly worsted.

Recent battles had taken place before fortified buildings at Ossawatamie and Lecompton, generally believed to be the block-house at Lecompton, occupied by Col. Titus and Woodson.

Thirty of Buford's men have been captured.

Free State prisoners have been released, though no positive statements confirm it.

Circulars, extras and hand bills signed by Atchison, Stringfellow and other pro-slavery leaders of Platte county have been started in Jackson, Lafayette, Johnson, Clay, Buchanan, Saline, and Carroll counties, to rally at rendezvous at New Santa Fe, Jackson county, 20th March, instantly.

The St. Louis Republican of yesterday says: "It is not concealed that the border counties make common cause with the pro-slavery men of the Territory, and this week there will be 1000 men in pursuit of the abolitionists." No accounts received from the Free State sources.
