FRANKLIN, Kansas, Nov. 25.

Last Saturday evening thirty one prisoners escaped from the prison in Tecumseh, by cutting two holes through the walls with a musket bayonet used in the cells for a candle stick. They had been confined there nearly a week, guarded by a company of U. S. infantry.

Col. Henry T. Titus, of Leecompton, is about to leave the territory with a hundred men for Nicaragua, to assist President Walker. He says after Central America is all right, he intends going over into Cuba, and revolutionize that island, and gain it for the South, and the South alone. Col. T. has been a fillibuster all his life and was once in Cuba, under the unfortunate Lopez. He sent Walker the first company of men ever sent from the States.
