A DUEL.—A duel was fought, on the 1st instant near Fort Smith Landing, in the Cherokee Nation, between George W. Clarke, Esq., editor of the Arkansas Intelligencer, and John D. Logan, one of the editors of the Frontier Whig. Robert West was the second of Clarke, and William Walker was the second of Logan. They fought with rifles, at sixty yards distance. Two shots were fired without effect. The hostile meeting grew out of a personal insult given to Mr. Clarke, through the columns of the Whig. After the two ineffectual shots, Logan's friends inquired if Clarke was satisfied; to which he replied that he would be satisfied if Logan would promise never to make personal mention of him again. This promise was made, and the parties separated.
