DIAZ LEAVES MEXICO TO-DAY.

Consuls at Vera Cruz Pay Their Respects to Him-He Is Much Better.

VERA CRUZ, May 20.—The Consular Corps, representing sixteen countries and headed by United States Consul William Canada, Dean of the corps, paid their respects to Gen. Diaz this morning. The ex-President greeted all most cordially and had a pleasant word for each.

Gen. Diaz, accompanied by Señora Diaz, Porfirio Diaz, Jr., and his wife, five grandchildren, and other members of the family, will go aboard the steamer Ypiranga to-morrow afternoon. The steamer will sail for Spain the same night or the following day.

Those who have visited the ex-President report that he is much improved physically. The swelling in his face has disappeared, and all danger of blood poisoning, with which he was threatened, has passed.
