

Six Cubans Summoned Before Miami Grand Jury

A pro-dialogue exile leader and five Cubans once active in the anti-Castro movement in South Florida have been summoned to appear before a Miami federal grand jury Jan. 18.

There is no indication of the exact nature of the grand jury's probe.

The pro-dialogue leader, the Rev. Manuel Espinosa, has been a target of terrorist attacks.

Also scheduled to testify are Armando Lopez-Estrada, Miami real estate broker and former military chief of Brigade 2506 Veterans Association; Felipe Rivero Diaz, Miami

automobile salesman and founder of the Cuban Nationalist Movement; Ricardo Morales Navarrete, former CIA contract employe, Castro agent, and Venezuelan security chief, now in retirement in Miami; Manuel Ortega, an admitted former terrorist now in the Federal Witness Protection program, who turned state's evidence against Gustavo Castillo and Orestes Ruiz Hernandez in the 1976 bombing of an Angela Davis appearance at the University of Miami; and Felipe Gonzalez Sarrain, a former Cuban lawyer who fled Cuba when Castro took over.

Cinco cubanos que una vez se mantuvieron activos en el movimiento anticastrista en el Sur de la Florida recibieron notificaciones para presentarse ante un gran jurado federal en Miami el 18 de enero.

No se ha indicado la naturaleza de la pesquisa del Gran Jurado.

Entre los que deben acudir a testificar figuran Armando López-Estrada, ex jefe militar de la Asociación de Veteranos de la Brigada 2506; Felipe Rivero Díaz, fundador del Movimiento Nacionalista Cubano; Ricardo Morales Navarrete, ex empleado bajo contrato de la Agencia Central de Inteligencia (CIA); Manuel Ortega, quien ha admitido haber cometido actividades terroristas; y Felipe González Sarrain, abogado cubano exiliado.
