I went to Delmonico's with W B C Web ster, Lag, and Captain Spencer, about one o'clock. On leaving the hotel and galoing the sidewalk on Beaver street, I was accosted by Gen eral Wheat, who, without any introduction, ask me if I was Colonel Cauty I replied in the affirmative, on which he said that he had sent me a challenge at Greytown, which I had thrown to the ground Those were his words. He imme

distoly spat in my face and struck me with his right hand above the left ere, both of which not I at once returned. I asked him for his card, telling him not to make a blackguard of him While he was handing me the card with his left hand, with his right he produced a knobbed

stick, and struck me twice on the head above the left temple, which second blow felled me to the ground and which caused the blood to flow coplously, and while there he kicked mein the body. The bystanders and my friends interfer ed, whereon I was enabled to rise. I was per perfectly unarmed and surprised, as I had med

him frequently before, both in Greytown fand in this city, without recognition. When first I mes the General in Greytown, after their defeat at Castillo Viego, he sent me a private challenge, which I disregarded, by the advice of Com. Erskine, and Capis. Osborne and Dunlop, of the British ficet, on the grounds that

as he was virtually a prisoner of war, in the hab it of insulting and challenging everybody (which they had personally experienced,) and had no grounds for private quarrel or wrongs to redicts,

I should be insane to take any more notice of him than they had done. I have not had other

relationship with him, and have never reflected upon his private character, and would now con sider myself wanting in self respect to take furth-

er notice of an act of rowdy isin
