

A New Paper in Kansas.

Mr. JAMES REDPATH, the intelligent and fearless Kansas correspondent of the *Chicago Tribune*, will commence publishing, during the present month, at Doniphan, K. T., a Free State weekly newspaper, to be called *The Crusader of Freedom*. Mr. Redpath, in his prospectus, says that he "will endeavor, by truly reporting every diversity of opinion and policy, to make the names of its special contributors are those of Gen. James H. Lane; Wm. A. Phillips, correspondent of the *New York Tribune*, and author of "The Conquest of Kansas," M. F. Conway and Morris Hunt, Judges and Phillip C. Schuyler, Secretary of the Free State organization; Henry J. Adams, Mayor of Lawrence City; Richard Realf, Esq., and others. Gen. Lane is preparing for its columns a history of his experience in Kansas, "for the purpose of doing justice to the real actors who distinguished themselves during the troubles." This will bring to light many interesting and important documents, and explain the origin of many events hitherto unpublished, misrepresented, or suppressed. It will also embrace an accurate and extended history of the civil wars in the Territory.

The Crusader will be illustrated, and will publish, in regular succession, a series of portraits of Kansas celebrities, each portrait being accompanied by a biography of its subject.—Among the persons to be thus distinguished, are Governors Reeder, Shannon, Geary, Walker, Robinson, Gen. Lane, Capt. Walker, Col. Titus, Mr. Whitfield, Mr. Parrott, Judges LeCompte, Cato and Lincoln, Secretary Woolson, Marshal Donaldson, Mayor Adams, the Free State martyrs, Judges of the Free State organization, founders of the Emigrant Aid Company, &c.

The paper is also intended to be an accurate and reliable guide for the emigrant; exposing the fraudulent speculations by which persons coming into the Territory have been and are so frequently swindled and deceived.
