U.S. Expresses Its Regret To Cuba Over Bombing

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10 (AP) — The United States expressed deep regret today over a bombing last Friday at the Cuban Mission to the United Nations.

It was the second such incident at the mission, and Thomas Reston, a State Department spokesman, said the administration "repudiates these senseless acts of violence." He also offered assurances that the "full force of the law" would be used to capture and convict those responsible.

The Cuban Government has lodged a protest with the United States over the incident, he said, adding that the State Department had expressed its regrets to Cuban authorities in New York, Washington and Havana.

Mr. Reston said the United States would not provide compensation for damage because the mission had insurance covering such acts of violence.
