

Rev. James W. C. Pennington, a colored minister in N. Y., was forcibly ejected from one of the cars of the Sixth Avenue Railroad last week. The conductor notified him that it was against the rules for black people to ride with white people, but the reverend gentleman paying no attention, he was seized by the coat collar and put out. Undertaking to make a demonstration against the conductor afterwards, he was arrested and taken to the Tombs, but, after an admonition from the Justice, he was let go. He has carried the matter to the higher courts, and the result will be quite interesting.
