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Q To your knowledge?

A Yes.

Q Did you ever work with Dr. Artime in the M-I-R-R?

A Artime never worked in the MIRR. Remember, there are two different organizations, two different leaders. Dr. Bosch was the leader of the MIRR.

I notified the American Government that there was a plot to disrupt and possibly do harm to Mr. Kissinger and, also, the president of a foreign country when he would arrive to this country.

Yes, I advised the government of this plot.

Q Were you aware that Mr. Artime arranged for Bosch' release from the Costa Rican jail?

A No, I was not aware of that.

Q Did you know the Lanz Brothers?

A Comandante Pedro Díaz Lanz has been a friend of mine over a period of many, many years. Pedro, I knew in Cuba when I came out of the mountains at one particular time. I was introduced to Pedro Díaz Lanz in Santiago de Cuba, where both him and myself went out of Cuba to do a series of operations to bring supplies into Cuba for the guerrillas.

Q Do you remember when you first met Mr. Pedro Díaz Lanz?

A Mmm -- that's going back many years ago. I would believe it was either 1957, 1958.

Q Mr. Lanz indicated 1957, so your memory is most correct.

A Either one, because I know I came out of the mountains those two years.

Q And you were familiar with his brother, Marcos?

A Yes. Marcos was the second chief of the Cuban Air Force. His position was Inspector
