ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE FUNERALS OF MISS DUFF AND MR. TITUS-THEIR BODIES REMOVED FROM SEA CLIFF, L. I. TO BROOKLYN.

The bodies of Miss Mary S. Duff, of No. 399 Clinton-st., and her fiance, Ellett L. Titus, of No. 440 Clinton-st., who were found dead in a bathhouse at

No new light was thrown upon the tragedy yes-There was some talk of a double funeral, but the friends could not agree upon the details. The family of Miss Duff desired public ceremonies, and the friends of Mr. Titus wished to have only private ser-

terday. The autopsy showed that heart disease was the cause of Miss Duff's death, but whether chloroform produced it or not could not be told. There was a small vial of chloroform in the pocket of the coat which Mr. Titus wore.
